I wonder which of these statements you would rather hear?

I know I react badly to the first, and I love to hear the second. I believe that is no accident. I believe it's the way I was made. I believe in a God of stories, and the power of story. Tell me that I need to behave and I want to ask Why? Tell me a story about who I am, and I am inspired to live up to that.

I hope it's obvious that my passion like those who are part of Mid Deeside, is for wrestling with the stories in scripture, and I keep finding that those writers seem more concerned with helping people understand who they are, than making them behave in certain ways, or getting them into some Holy club. The overriding idea that God seems determined to get across is that every single one of us was made to be part of what God is doing, and invited to be part of what God is doing. Most surprisingly of all, nothing in our past needs to get in the way. God doesn't see our mistakes and our messes as the things that define us. Instead he sees our potential. He has dealt with our mistakes (the bible is packed full of people making mistakes!) and seems determined to remind us of who we were made to be, who we are invited to be.

In our time of vacancy there is much looking back, and looking forward, but be encouraged. Your Kirk Session is in good heart and God is a work here as he always has. I hope you find this magazine full of good news stories. I hope you find yourself in these stories, and are reminded of who God made you to be, and what you are invited to be part of.

VACANCY NEWS

Since the last update on the vacancy in the August edition of this Newsletter, we have continued to advertise our vacancy. We advertised in the Church of Scotland "Life and Work" magazine in May and have continued to repeat that advert since then. It has also now been placed in the Presbyterian Herald, which is the official magazine of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland. It has been placed in the United Reformed magazine which is published by the United Reformed Church, but has readers from all Christian denominations, and placed in the Chronicle magazine, which is produced and distributed by the churches in the Westhill area.

We are also investigating the possibility of promoting our vacancy with a London based organisation called Rural Ministries, who specialise in recruiting ministers who would like to serve in rural areas. Although predominantly serving England there is no reason why we may not find a minister who would like to come to Scotland.

As well as advertising as I have just described, we have also written personal letters to a number of serving ministers, inviting them to consider our vacancy.

So far, sadly, we have had no positive response to our efforts. However we realise that there are 133 vacant charges in the CoS and only a handful of newly ordained or probationary ministers to fill these vacancies.

In the course of our activities we have become aware that there are some parishes in the CoS who have serving ministers who joined from overseas. We know of at least one country which has more ministers than vacancies to fill. Therefore, if we continue to be unsuccessful in our efforts here, then this is an avenue we may consider pursuing in the future.

Going forward, we will continue to use all reasonable available means of advertising our vacancy, but there is one means of advertising, that we have not used to its full advantage, and that is "word of mouth".

So, what the Nominating Committee would like to do, is to ask each and every one of you to reach out and spread the word of our vacancy. If you have relatives, friends or acquaintances around the area, or anywhere else in the country, whether they are church going people or not, can we ask you to make them aware of our vacancy and ask them in turn to make their friends and relatives aware. If they know, or hear of, any minister they think might be ready to answer a new call please ask them to let us know.

If you do receive KIT but find it is not relevant to you or, for any reason, you no longer wish to subscribe, again please let me know and I will take you off the circulation list.





TRAIDCRAFT

We would like to start by saying a huge thank you to everyone who supported our recent Coffee and Buttery Morning. We were so pleased to have so many happy customers browsing the cards and gifts on the Traidcraft stall and above all enjoying FAIRTRADE time with others to sit and chat over coffee. There was a lovely



buzz about the Lochnagar room and we even had to put some extra tables in the fover! The butteries and other food was purchased from Scotmid who very kindly gave a voucher to support the event. There was a great team of helpers on the door, serving tables, washing up and helping on the stall and their help is as always very much appreciated. Overall there was £323 raised between the door and raffle and the sale of goods was £771.60 which was fantastic.

Recently we have been hearing about the financial problems being faced by Traidraft and the uncertain future ahead and we are pleased that they are working through a recovery plan and hope to continue operating albeit in a smaller scale. However we are also saddened that many of the employees will lose their jobs and that the Traidcraft Organisation will have to work with fewer producers than previously. The money raised from the coffee and buttery morning will be going to help support those producers and we hope to have more information in the new year about what the new Traidcraft Organisation will look like and how we can continue to support small Fairtrade producers through Traidcraft.



Editor's Note: I received this little story from Mrs. Dorothy Taylor recently. She thought the girls and boys might like to read about "Glen" the Dog-next-door. I'm sure you will **all** enjoy reading it !

My neighbours, Marieanne and Gary have three "Search and Rescue" dogs. They are beautiful dogs and very highly trained. Gary often takes the 'boys' over into the field opposite my house and I can watch them go through their training programme. 

Christmas Tree Festival

Excitement is mounting for this year's **Christmas Tree Festival** which will be held on **14 and 15 December, Friday 1.30 to 4.00** and **7.00 to 8.30** and **Saturday 1.00 to 5.00 pm**

Both last year and in 2016 our church was filled with a wonderful display of imaginatively decorated Christmas trees which were much admired by all who came to see, adults as well as children. We have again invited local groups, clubs, businesses and individuals to contribute a tree and we expect to have over 30 beautiful trees on display – each one unique.

Whilst you view the trees there will also be lots of entertainment on offer from "performers" aged 0 to 101. Torphins School Choir will sing on Friday at 2.00. There will be a "Music Box" session for pre-school children and carers on Saturday at 2.30, and the Festival will close with half an hour of carol singing led by the church choir on Saturday at 4.30 pm. Between times, we have a number of talented young people playing piano, violin, bagpipes and possibly tuba; as well as talented adult performers.

Light refreshments will be provided free of charge. Our church youth leaders will be on hand throughout for craft activities with children, the results of which will be added to the Rocking Stones Christmas Tree.

Entry to view the trees is free but donations will be welcomed and will all be given to H**ome Start Deeside & Donside**, a local charity which helps families with young children.

The **Home Start children** will themselves be decorating one of the trees. We invite any of you who wish to do so to put small presents round this tree for distribution by the Home Start volunteers to the families they are helping. Home Start have told us that small luxuries for adults as well as presents for the children would be most welcome as the parents of families who are being helped themselves often don't receive anything. **Any presents you wish to give will be very much appreciated** – you can bring them to church ahead of the Festival or simply put them under the tree when you visit. Please include a gift label indicating whether the gift is for a boy, girl, man or woman and, if for a child, the approximate age of child.
