We are so thankful to have received a grant that allowed us to put in a much better livestreaming system that can be used not only for worship, but for funerals and all events! This year, we will celebrate in anticipation of the birth of Christ at church on Sunday Mornings as we light the advent candles, at our homes as we count down the days, with our hands as we reach out to serve those less fortunate than us.

I hope you will join us for one of our Christmas Eve services this year in the church, or by watching on facebook or youtube. The Candlelight Family Service is at 6:30pm and the Watch Night Service at 11:30pm on Christmas Eve. I am always delighted to worship right along beside you.
